- Average 12 public performances a year for service organizations, professional associations, festivals, and concerts...
- Perform a broad range of musical styles including traditional men's chorus selections * spirituals * contemporary * jazz * show tunes * original works * a capella * accompanied...
- Produced a cassette recording with Kappa Studios in 1988...
- Distinctions include: Winners of the regional C.B.C. Radio Choral Competition in 1988 * Broadcast on C.B.C Radio's "Choral Concert" in May 1988 * Performed with the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra and the Winnipeg Philharmonic Choir in December 1988 * Invited to perform at the prestigious "Canadian Choral Festival" in Toronto in May, 1989 and in Winnipeg in May 1990 * Performed for the "International Big Sing" - a male choir festival held in Winnipeg in June 1988...
