University of Manitoba BISON MEN'S CHORUS

The BISON MEN'S CHORUS is celebrating its tenth season. Organized with an initial three year grant from the President's Academic Development Fund, the CHORUS has performed in a wide variety of concerts and appearances including Community Service events, University and Alumni functions, International Festivals, and a joint concert with the University of North Dakota male chorus in Fargo, North Dakota. They have accepted an invitation to perform at the 1996 Intercollegiate Male Chorus Biennial Symposium to be held on the campus of the University of Wisconsin, Eau Claire. This is the third album they have produced. The CHORUS has been heard on local and national radio broadcasts. It is comprised of 50 - 60 members in any given year, representing undergraduate and graduate students, faculty, staff, alumni and other men from the Winnipeg community. Their repertoire consists of traditional male chorus selections, spirituals, jazz arrangements, folk and art songs, arrangements of show and popular songs, and commissioned works. Selections are variously performed acappella or accompanied by piano, organ or instrumental ensembles. The CHORUS is a member of the Intercollegiate Male Choruses, Inc.

Dr. Larry Patterson, associate professor of Music Education in the Faculty of Education, is the founding conductor. He also conducts the University of Manitoba Vocal Jazz Ensemble. He has coordinated the graduate studies program in music education since 1979. Larry is the vice-president of the Intercollegiate Male Choruses, Inc.

The CHORUS accompanist since 1993, is Mr. Conrad Hoepfner, a piano major in the School of Music. Tonight's concert features guest accompanist, Mr. Cameron Friesen, who holds the Bachelor of Music Degree in piano, and is graduating this year from the Faculty of Education with a Bachelor of Education degree in Music Education.
