BISON MEN'S CHORUS

The University of Manitoba BISON MEN'S CHORUS is celebrating its thirteenth season. Organized with an initial three year grant from the President's Academic Development Fund, the Chorus has performed in a wide variety of concerts and appearances including Community Service events, University and Alumni functions, International Festivals, and joint concerts with other choruses and groups.

Over the years, the Chorus has produced three tapes, the latest entitled, "BROWN AND GOLD," available in tape and CD formats, is available at this concert. (CD price \$10.00).

The Chorus is comprised of approximately 50 members in any given year, representing undergraduate and graduate students, faculty, staff, alumni and other men from the Winnipeg community. The repertoire consists of traditional male chorus selections, spirituals, jazz arrangements, folk and art songs, arrangements of show and popular songs, and commissioned works. Selections are variously performed acappella or accompanied by piano, organ or instrumental ensembles. The Chorus is a member of the Intercollegiate Male Choruses, Inc., and is associated with the School of Music, University of Manitoba.

Our founding conductor, Dr. Larry Patterson recently retired after 12 seasons with the Chorus. This year, we are fortunate to have Reno Gerl as our Music Director. He is ably assisted by our accompanist, Carey Denby.

Plans are underway for next year's season, which will include a tour to Morris, Minnesota in October, a tour to Gimli in November, and our annual Bison Christmas Feeste on December 5. During the Spring term, the Chorus will begin recording sessions for a new album.
