The CHORUS is a Program of the School of Music. It also is a member of the Intercollegiate Male Choruses, Inc. It has approximately 50 members. Its repertoire consists of traditional male chorus selections: spirituals, jazz arrangements, folk and art songs, sacred music, show pieces and commissioned works. It has produced three tapes and one CD.

In addition to its annual Christmas Medieval Feast in December and Spring Concert, it performs at a variety of concerts during the year. This past season it sang at the campuses of the University of Minnesota in Morris and Crookston in October. It performed with the Gimli Men's Choir and at ChoralFest Manitoba in November. In February it joined with the Women of Note and Ron Paley for a concert at St. Mary's Cathedral. It was a guest choir at the Men Only Festival on April 16th.

RENO GERL - conductor. Reno was the associate conductor of the C的我知多 in the 1995-96 Season before becoming conductor in 1997. He is a graduate of the School of Music and the Faculty of Education at the University of Manitoba. As a music educator, he divides his time between being the Music Supervisor of the St. Boniface School Division and music teacher at Windsor Park Collegiate. He plays trumpet for the River City Band and sings with The Riffs, a four-voice a cappella group. He has been involved as conductor and clinician for local instrumental and choral ensembles.

STEVE DENBY - associate conductor. Steve attended the University of Manitoba where he sang with the University Singers. Upon graduation he began a teaching career. Since 1989 he has overseen the music program at Ecole River Heights School. Steve has served as director for the Dutch Canadian Choir and has co-directed the Central Manitoba Youth Choir. For relaxation he plays in Streamline, a weekend country dance band, and appears in theatre productions put on by Regents Park United Church.
