Amabile Boys Choirs

The Amabile Boys Choirs were founded in 1990 by directors Dr. Carol Beynon and Mr. Bevan Keating. Striving to provide musical experiences of the highest level, the choirs enrol 85 singers from Southwestern Ontario. The three ensembles include a Training Choir, a Treble Concert Choir, and a Tenor Bass Ensemble. The choirs have toured extensively, including competition tours to England and Wales, Austria and Germany. They have performed in Westminster Abbey, Canterbury Cathedral, and at Wales' Eisteddfodd Music Festival. They presented concerts and workshops in the Caribbean, represented Ontario on Canada Day at Ottawa, and competed successfully in three consecutive CBC national choir competitions. Their 1995 CD, "Christmas with the Amabile Boys Choirs, " was followed by "Folkalizing", folk songs of the world, released in the fall of 1999. In March, 2000, Amabile Boys Choirs hosted and performed with Canada's Tafelmusik Baroque Orchestra. Invited to return as an International Choir by AmericaFest, the boys travelled to Minnesota in the summer of 2000 to be featured at one of the world's premier male choir festivals. With new director Ken Fleet, Carol and the boys will participate by invitation in Newfoundland's Festival 500 in July 2001.

Bison Men's Chorus

The Bison Men's Chorus was established to be a community-based choir made up of University of Manitoba undergraduate and graduate students, faculty, staff, alumni and men from the community who like to sing choral selections set for the male voice. Conductor Dr. Larry Patterson founded the Chorus in 1984. The Chorus has approximately 50 members. Its repertoire consists of spirituals, jazz arrangements, folk and art songs, sacred music, show pieces and commissioned works.

The Chorus has made 4 recordings, the most recent being a CD entitled "Heard in Manitoba" that has just become available.

Steve Denby, Conductor

Steve joined the Chorus as associate conductor in January 1999, and was appointed Director in July 1999. He is a graduate of the University of Manitoba, holding Bachelor of Education and Bachelor of Music degrees. While a student he sang with the University Singers, conducted by Henry Engbrecht. Since 1989 he has overseen the music program at Ecole River Heights School. He has served as director of the Dutch Canadian Choir and has co-directed the Central Manitoba Youth Choir. For relaxation he plays in "Streamline", a weekend country-dance band.
